ULTRASOUND STUDY OF WHOLE ABDOMEN

Excessive gaseous abdomen.

- **Liver** is mildly enlarged in size (~151mm) and shows increased echotexture of liver parenchyma. No intrahepatic biliary radicle dilatation is seen. No space occupying lesion is seen. Hepatic veins and IVC are seen normally.
- **Gall bladder** is normal in size and shows anechoic lumen. No calculus / mass lesion is seen. GB walls are not thickened.
- **CBD** is normal at porta. No obstructive lesion is seen.
- **Portal vein** Portal vein is normal at porta.
- **Pancreas** is normal in size and shows homogenous echotexture of parenchyma. PD is not dilated. No parenchymal calcification is seen. No peripancreatic collection is seen.
- **Spleen** is normal in size and shows homogenous echotexture of parenchyma. No SOL is seen.
- No retroperitoneal adenopathy is seen.
- No ascites is seen.
- **Both kidneys** are normal in size and position. No hydronephrosis is seen. **Small calculi / concretions are seen at mid pole in both kidneys measuring approx 3.5mm in right kidney and 3.7mm in left kidney.** No mass lesion is seen. Cortico-medullary differentiation is well maintained. Parenchymal thickness is normal. No scarring is seen. Right kidney measures 93 x 47 mm in size. Left kidney measures 99 x 51 mm in size.
- **Ureters** Both ureters are not dilated. UVJ are seen normally.
- **Urinary bladder** is normal contour with anechoic lumen. No calculus or mass lesion is seen. UB walls are not thickened.
- Bilateral seminal vesicles are seen normally.
- **Prostate** is normal in size measures 33 x 33 x 30 mm with weight of 18 gms and shows homogenous echotexture of parenchyma. No mass lesion is seen.

OPINION:

- **MILD HEPATOMEGALY WITH FATTY INFILTRATION OF LIVER GRADE-I.**
- **BILATERAL SMALL RENAL CALCULI / CONCRETIONS.**

(Possibility of acid peptic disease could not be ruled out).

Clinical correlation is necessary.
